Experts converge to discuss what the future of business technology will look like in Australia

- The promise and the challenge - consumer security and the Internet of Things
- IoT platforms and interoperability - getting it right the first time is hard, but not impossible

FinTech examines the impact to the Australian landscape of banking and investments including:

- Disruption in banking – how will neobanks, start-ups, digital and mobile change the future of banking

- Investments – how is FinTech changing the way we invest?

AI and Machine Learning topics include:
